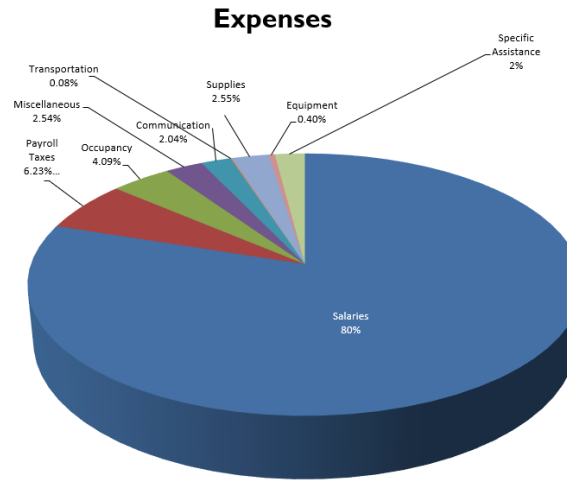

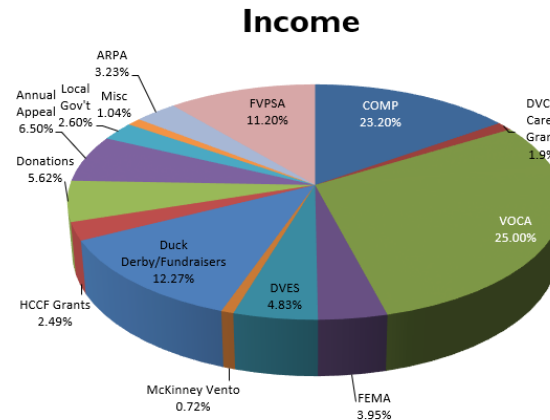

Community Partnerships

Domestic Harmony is grateful for the generous support that we receive each year from multiple organizations, community groups, corporations and individuals in Hillsdale County. We would like to highlight a partnership with the Hillsdale County Community Foundation. We were the recipient of the V.C. and Velma Knight Grant of \$5,750 through the foundation. Their YOUTH program donated food and various supplies for the shelter. This donation helped provide meals and hygiene products to residents.

Community Prevention Education

Domestic Harmony provided prevention education for dating violence, domestic violence and sexual assault to schools in Hillsdale County reaching 144 students.

Survey results from our high school students:

- 34.2% have witnessed domestic violence in their families.
- 50.5% have witnessed teen dating violence
- 20.9% report they have been a victim of dating violence.

Donations

Domestic Harmony could not meet the needs of our clients without the help of many community groups and individuals. Each year churches, civic groups, and individuals gather items to donate to the shelter. These items include; food, paper products, cleaning supplies, diapers, clothes, etc. In the last fiscal year we received a total value of \$17,315 in donated goods.

Volunteers

Domestic Harmony also benefits from committed volunteers who give their time as shelter volunteers and to provide maintenance on the shelter. This year we had 16 volunteers who gave their time and talents to Domestic Harmony. Each shelter volunteer works five-hour shifts answering the crisis line and staffing the shelter. Hours volunteered at the shelter totaled 484 this fiscal year.
